

COVID-19 and PreK - 12 Education



March 23 - Governor Northam ordered the closure of all PreK-12 schools for the academic year

PreK - 12 Waivers, Guidance and Budget Impacts:

- -VDOE FAQs
- -C4L (Continuity for Learning) Task Force convened and report issued to support educators
- -Graduation Requirement Flexibility & Guidance
- -Recovery and Accreditation Task Forces
- -Federal Assessment Waivers
- -State budget implications and flexibility



Emergency Federal Funds - ESSER

There are 2 major federal emergency funds now available from the CARES Act for PreK-12.

Elementary and Secondary School
Education Relief Fund (ESSER Fund)

- \$238M for Virginia
- 90% to local school divisions based on the Title I, Part A formula
- 10% can be used by the VDOE for coronavirus related agency needs and statewide responses





Emergency Federal Funds - GEER

<u>Governor's Emergency Education</u> <u>Relief Fund</u> (GEER Fund)

- \$66M for Virginia
- Incredibly flexible block grant that can be dispensed at the Governor's discretion to support early childhood, PreK-12 and higher education.
- Application due from Governor's office by June 1 - still under consideration by the Governor





Re-Opening Virginia's Schools

Phased reopening of in-person instruction under consideration as public health situation evolves.


Return to School Recovery Task Force

- State Superintendent convened Recovery Task Force with school leaders from across the Commonwealth
- Subcommittee looked specifically at operational considerations for reopening
- Report presented to Secretary Qarni's COVID-19 Education Workgroup
- Consultation is ongoing with state public health officials
